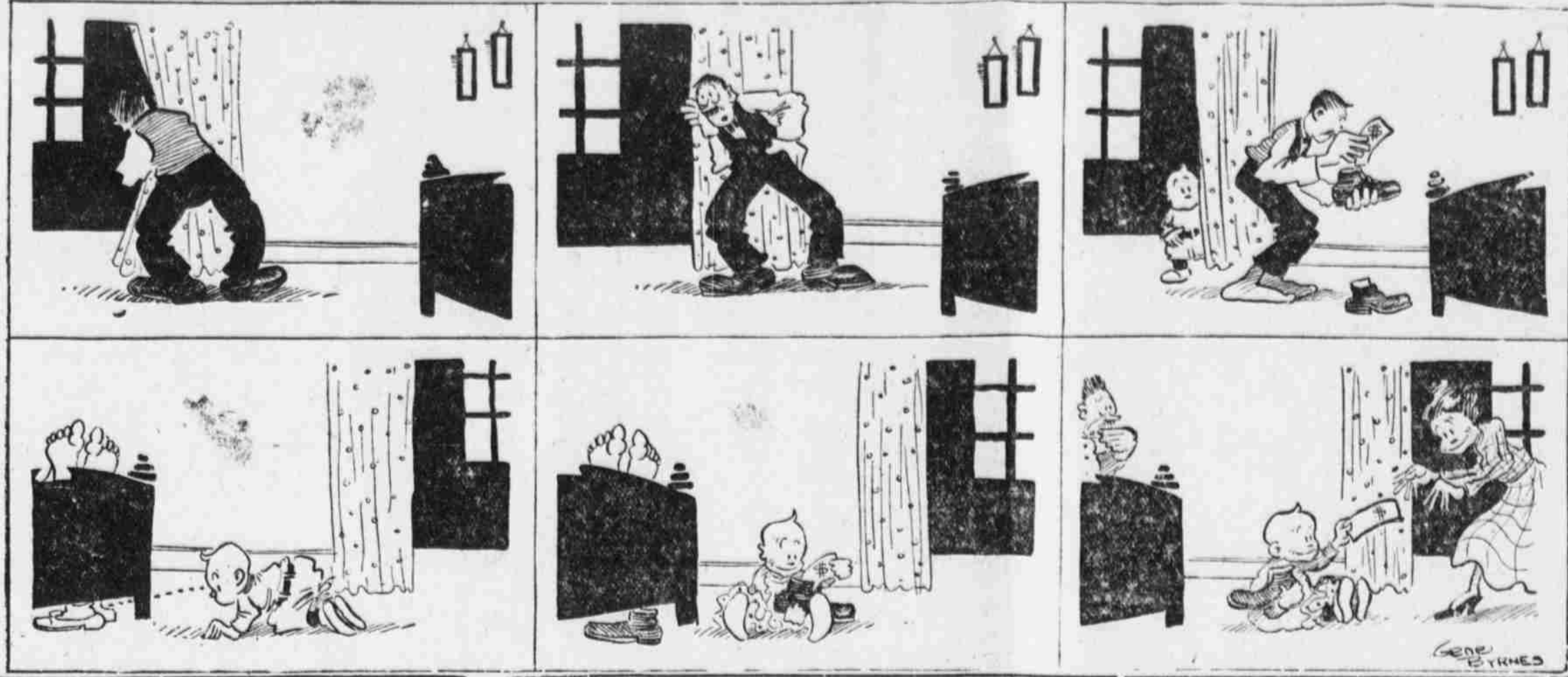

WEEKLY MARKETGRAM
(U. S. Bureau of Market)

Fruits and Vegetables.
Potatoes weakened slightly at the northern shipping stations, closing \$1-11.20. Chicago car-lot market down 0c-15c at \$1.20-\$1.30 sacked. Round Whites at western New York stations 15c last week's prices. Bulk stock steady New York \$1.50-\$1.65.
Car-lot shipments week ended March 15th: potatoes, 3,750 cars.

Hay.
Receipts and demand moderate in principal markets. Active demand for best grades; low grades selling slowly. Chicago reports heavy receipts, especially timothy, with market showing weaker tendency. Very little No. 1 clover mixed or timothy arriving at Kansas City. Cincinnati market very firm; light receipts; urgent demand. Eastern markets quiet at unchanged prices. Quoted: No. 1 timothy \$24.50 Cincinnati; \$31.50 New York; \$24 Chicago; \$27.50 Memphis; \$20 Minneapolis. No. 2 timothy: \$22.50 Cincinnati; \$29 New York; \$20 Chicago; \$17.50 Minneapolis. No. 1 clover mixed: \$22 Cincinnati; \$17 Minneapolis; \$22 Philadelphia. No. 1 prairie: \$16 Minneapolis. No. Midland, \$11 Minneapolis. No. 1 alfalfa: \$24.50 at Cincinnati; \$21 Minneapolis.

Grain.
Bearish government crop report and general financial and economic situation caused almost precipitous price declines until the 15th, when reports of green bug damage in Oklahoma and report of 5,000,000 bushels wheat sold for export to principal European countries brought about a sharp upturn. Mills reported buying futures in Chicago. Two million bushels Argentine wheat sold to European countries on the 16th at 3 1/2c-7c under American prices. In Chicago cash market: No. 2 Red Winter wheat 18 1/2c-19 1/2c over; Chicago May; No. 2 hard, 9 1/2c-12 1/2c over; No. 3 mixed corn 5 1/2c-6 1/2c under; May; No. 3 yellow 4 1/2c-6 1/2c under. For the week Chicago May wheat down 8 1/2c at \$1.51 1/2, May corn 2c at 69 1/2c. Minneapolis May wheat down 7 1/2c at \$1.45 1/2, Kansas City May 8 1/2c at \$1.45 1/2, Winnipeg May 5 1/2c at \$1.45 1/2. Minneapolis flour sales liberal. No. 2 dark wheat 12c-25c over Minneapolis May. Kansas City milling and export demand good. No. 2 hard 13c over Kansas City May.

Dairy Products.
Butter markets continue weak and unsettled at prices 4c-6c lower than a week ago. Heaviest price declines in eastern markets and closing quotes indicate that further changes are likely as Chicago is higher than eastern markets. Recent arrivals Danish at New York; several other important cargoes due. New Zealand butter steers in San Francisco also reported being shipped east. Closing prices 2c score: New York and Boston 45c; Chicago 45 1/2c; Philadelphia 44c.

Live Stock and Meats.
Sharp declines in Chicago hog prices during the past few days caused a net decline of 70c-\$1.10 for the week. Beef steers down 10c-25c; butcher cows and heifers 25c-50c. Feeder steers up 25c. Fat lambs down 50c per 100 lbs. March 16 Chicago prices: hogs, bulk of sales \$8.90-\$10.35; medium and good beef steers \$8.40-\$10; butcher cows and heifers \$5-\$9.50; feeder steers \$7.75-\$9.75; light and medium weight veal calves \$9.75-\$12.25; fat lambs \$8-\$10.50; feeding lambs \$7.25-\$9.40; yearlings \$7.50-\$8.75; fat ewes, \$5-\$6.35.
