Uncle Mose Kinkaid Files For One More Term in Congress

Congressman Moses P. Kinkaid of the big Sixth district filed nomination papers Monday as a candidate for re-election. He files as a republican candidate but is willing to accept votes from members of any party. His filing is nothing new to him. This is his eleventh experience. Of the ten nominations he has already had all but one was for re-election. He is now serving his twentieth successive year

as a member of congress from Nebraska. Once his resolution to quit the business of running for congress was fully determined. He withdrew from the race several years ago on account of his health, but before it was too late his health improved to such an extent that he changed his mind and got back into the struggle. Last fall he had about decided to stop running at the end of his twentieth year, or at the end of his present two-year term. An effort was made early in the present year to induce him to try for the United States senatorship. Finally he felt impelled to try once more on the ground that the chairmanship of the irrigation committee

needed his experience and the help of his committee clerk, A. H. Humphrey of Broken Bow, formerly state land commissioner of Nebraska.

Warren Lotspeich Draws \$100 Fine in County Court

Warren Lotspeich was fined \$100 and costs on the charge of illegally transporting liquor. The defendant has announced that he will appeal. The appeal bond was set at \$275. The evidence in the case brought out the fact that the liquor in question was found wrapped, in a coat in the Ford automobile of one Sanford Saling, also of Hemingford. Saling could not be found, and the car in which the liquor

was found was confiscated at the order of the court. Harry Gantz, attorney for the defendant, maintained that Lotspeich could not be guilty of transporting liquor as he was merely a passenger in the car. The court, however, ruled that the evidence brought out that Lotspeich knew of the presence of the liquor and was therefore equally guilty.

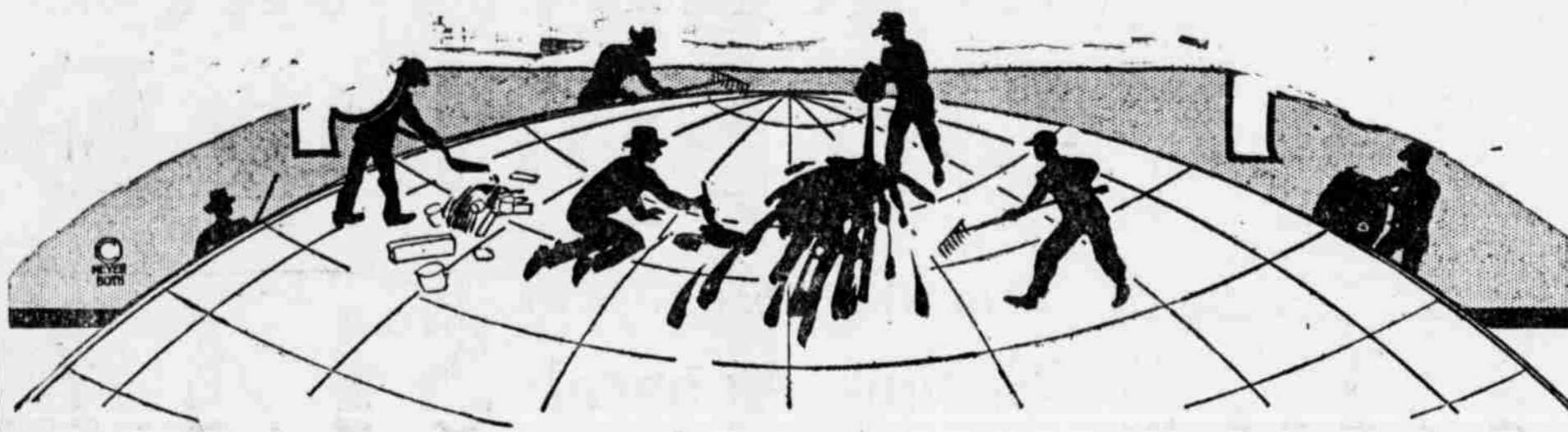
