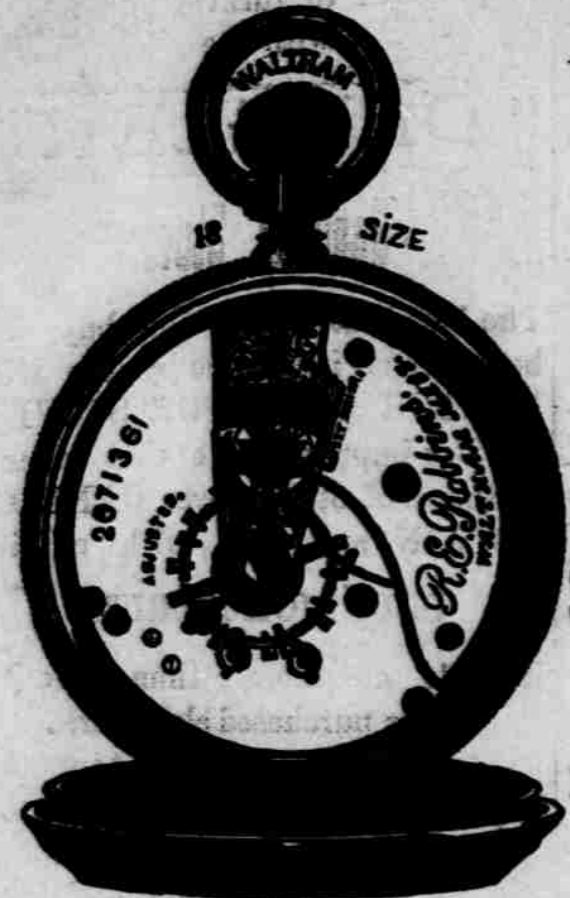

We have been handed the following with the request that it be published:—

The Episcopalians who refused to sit in convention with colored clergymen in the city of Charleston have been rebuked in a lengthy statement by the ministers who remained. The latter publish a letter addressed to them by Cardinal Gibbons in reply to questions they had asked. It looks queer to see one body of Episcopalians appeal to a cardinal against another portion of that denomination. But here is the letter of the cardinal, which explains itself:

Respected Sir: In reply to your inquiry, I beg to say that it is in accordance with the spirit of the Catholic Church, and of her practice, whenever practicable, to ordain clergy of the race that is to be evangelized.

When I attended the Vatican Council in 1869-1870 I saw around me in the Council chamber prelates of every color that characterizes the human family.

In the Propaganda College, Rome, colored students are nearly always found, and there is no distinction whatever between them and the whites. As far as I am informed, we have only one or two colored priests in the United States. We have here in Baltimore a Community of Colored Sisters which was established nearly half a century ago.

I hope the day is approaching when colored clergymen will be multiplied who will aid in preaching the Gospel and breaking the Bread of Life to the people of their own race.
