The Republican primary election for delegates to the county convention will take place next Thursday, May 24, in North Platte City precincts from five until eight o'clock p. m. and in the country precincts from six until eight, at the usual place of holding elections.

In consequence of the early date of the congressional convention, gentlemen who would like to warm Mr. Dorsey's seat in congress are putting in some pretty lively work. The time is short and they see the need of improving each shining hour.

There is some surprise expressed among politicians because the committee included the nomination of a candidate for congress in its call for the congressional district. They think that it is making the nomination too early, being in advance of the state and national nominations, and before the people had properly canvassed the subject and become acquainted with the candidates.
