THE CHOLERA EPIDEMIC. The Dread Disease Making a Deadly Path in the Old World.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27.—Advice received by the marine hospital bureau from the United States consul at Nagasaki, Japan, report 1,965 new cases of cholera and 49 deaths from this disease during the period from Aug. 18 to Sept. 11.

Reports from Russia state that the actual presence of cholera is not reported from any cities in the southern part of the empire, but that it is present in the localities occupied by Italian troops, and at Moscow about sixty deaths occur daily from the disease.
