Ralph Givens, colored, broke into a grocery store at Broken Bow a few nights ago and stole \$180 worth of goods.

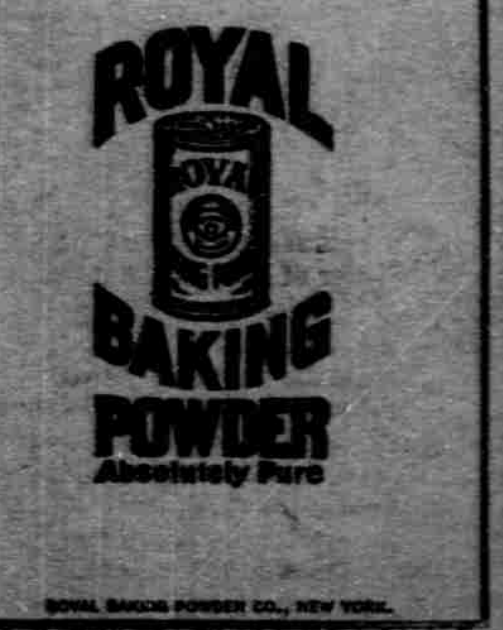
During the past year the treasurer of Hall county has paid and cancelled \$49,000 worth of county bonds.
