The wagon bridge over the south channel of the South Platte river was completed Wednesday, much to the satisfaction of travelers going north and south.

Down at Kearney an ordinance has been passed by the city council making it unlawful for water consumers to use city water during any other hours than from five to nine p. m. and five to nine a. m.

The Grand Island sugar factory, owing to a scarcity of beets, will not be operated this season. It is rumored that the machinery of the factory will be removed to the irrigated section of Nebraska, and that the company will lease sufficient land to grow the tonnage of beets required to keep the factory running to its full capacity. The leased lands would be cultivated by Russians imported for that purpose. This plan certainly seems to be a sensible one, and apparently the only one in which a sufficient tonnage of beets can be secured. The result of the experiment made with beets at Hershey this season may have a tendency to influence the factory company to locate in this section.
