The way matters are shaping themselves it is evident that the issue prior to and in the republican state convention will be Savage and anti-Savage. So far as THE TRIBUNE is concerned, it will oppose the renomination of Savage, and in this stand it will be backed by the republicans of this county and the west part of the state.

REPRESENTATIVES of organized labor in California appeared before the committee of foreign affairs at Washington yesterday and advocated the complete exclusion of the Chinese. They argued that by cheap living the Chinese are able to enter the labor field and work for wages that respectable American workmen could not afford to take.

The ways and means committee of the house will present to congress a bill repealing all war revenue taxes except that on mixed flour. The reduction following the enactment of the bill is estimated at sixty million dollars.

The bill introduced in congress for the leasing of public domain is ardently supported by large stockmen, but by the smaller ranchmen is regarded as a "freeze out" measure. We are inclined to believe that the views of the latter are correct and that concerted action by the small stock growers should be taken to oppose the measure.

CHAIRMAN PAYNE of the ways and means committee has assured the beet sugar men that there will be no revision of the Cuban tariff. The statement is regarded as final and has quieted grave fears of the success of sugar beet culture in Nebraska.

A business man yesterday in speaking of taxation remarked that if a man had one thousand dollars in gold and reported it to the assessor he would, under the present levy be taxed eighty dollars per year on the sum. In making this statement the aforesaid business man shows pitiable ignorance or else desires to pervert the facts. Property in this county is assessed at one-fifth its actual valuation and money is assessed at that rate.
