ONE railroad in Kansas has refused to give passes to delegates to political conventions, and several other roads announce that they have issued passes this year for "positively the last time."

nized as one of the leading candidates for congress from this district and will go into the convention backed by the delegation from every county in his judicial district. ACCORDING to the news dealt out to Filipinos things have been doing in this country. A Washington correspondent reports that there is undeniable evidence that the Hongkong junta sent to the native insurgents information that "President Roosevelt is in a state of seige in the executive palace" and that "so great is the demand of the Americans for Filipino independence that the American government has been compelled to mobilize troops at Washington to protect the president." The deluded natives are also told that "our friends in the American congress are championing our cause and threatening to call home the troops which are persecuting the Filipino people."

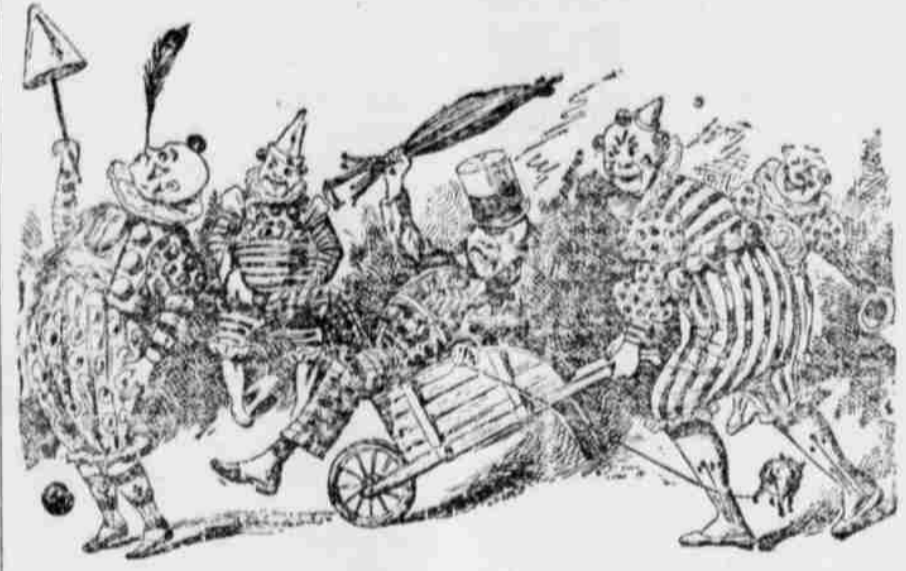
