COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS.
June 9, 1902.

Board met in special session according to published call by the county clerk as required by law. Present Robbins, McCullough and Kelleher, commissioners, and county clerk, when the following business was had and done.

Upon complaint of F. W. Woodgate of Walker precinct, the care of the Cross family is hereby turned over to the county poormaster.

Claim of S. Mang for rebate of taxes for year 1901, on account of unequal valuation is hereby rejected.

Claim of Jas. M. Ray for cash items as poormaster allowed on general fund for \$37.19.

Upon application C. F. Prietauer is granted permission to erect a cattle chute across the public road between southeast quarter of section 4, township 13, range 26, and southwest quarter of section 3, township 13, range 26. Said Prietauer to bear expense of construction and maintenance of said chute and hold the county harmless for any damage or expense, either for erection or maintenance.

Deeds for county lands were signed and executed as follows:

Southwest quarter section 33, township 15, range 29, to Mary E. Stiles.

North half of northwest quarter and southeast quarter of northwest quarter of section 24, town 9, range 29, to A. C. Barry.

Northwest quarter of section 1, town 9, range 30, to S. M. Hall.

Southwest quarter section 22, town 11, range 32, to C. E. Gibson.

Northwest quarter of section 32, township 13, range 32 to Wm. Robb.

Southeast quarter of section 10, township 13, range 33, to Wm. Robb.

Northeast quarter of section 34, township 11, range 32, to Chas. E. Gibson.

Southwest quarter of section 18, township 13, range 33, to Wm. Robb.

Southwest quarter of section 7, township 10, range 32, to Chas. E. Gibson.

Northeast quarter of section 17, township 10, to Jas. Woodworth.

Request of Fred. R. Ginn, county clerk, to rearrange his vault and index the same and to remove old and obsolete documents to the garret to make room for the proper conduct of his office is hereby granted.

Upon petition of E. H. Springer and others, G. M. Parsons is hereby appointed road overseer in Dist. 33, to fill vacancy.

The following land patents are hereby ordered recorded in order to complete chain of title to the county:

Southeast quarter of northeast quarter, north half southeast quarter and southwest quarter of southeast quarter of section 27-9-30.

East half northwest quarter and east half of southwest quarter of sec. 19-10-26.

South half northwest quarter and lots 3 and 4, of section 1-9-30.

South half southeast quarter and

south half southwest quarter of sec. 35-9-30.

West half of northwest quarter and west half of southwest quarter of section 27-16-26.

Lots 3 and 4 of section 31-9-27.

East half of southwest quarter and lots 3 and 4 of section 31-10-33.

In the matter of the application of T. R. Butler, of Beaver City, Neb., to have taxes stricken from the list, the board found no evidence that the property was erroneously assessed has been submitted. The treasurer of Lincoln county is hereby directed to proceed to collect the same.

C. F. Scharmann, county treasurer is hereby ordered to refund taxes paid under protest to Ware Costin Cattle Co., for the reason that tax was paid on the same property in Keith county in the years for the amounts as follows: For 1897 \$20.80, 1898, \$67.07, 1899 \$212.88, for 1900 \$280.93.

And to Michael Cox tax paid under protest on lot 4, block 7, of North Platte for the year 1901 to the amount of 14.00.
