PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT. The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebraska, as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, to be voted upon at a general election to be held Tuesday, November 3rd, A. D. 1908:

A JOINT RESOLUTION to amend Section two (2) of Article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, relating to the Legislature of the State of Nebraska:

Section 1. (Amendment proposed.) That Section two (2) of Article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended to read as follows:

A JOINT RESOLUTION to propose an Amendment to Section 9, Article 1 of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska. Be it Resolved and Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska:
