ORDER OF HEARING ON PETITION FOR APPOINTMENT OF ADMINISTRATOR The State of Nebraska, Lincoln County, In the County Court, August 10th, 1908.

To be amended to read as follows: Section 2. (Supreme court judges; jurisdiction.) The Supreme Court shall consist of seven (7) judges; and a majority of all elected and qualified judges shall be convened to constitute a quorum or pronounce a decision.

Section 3. (Amendment proposed.) That Section four (4) of Article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended to read as follows:

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.

The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebraska, as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 3rd, A. D. 1908.

A JOINT RESOLUTION to propose an Amendment to Section 9, Article 8 of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska:

Resolved and Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska:

Section 1. (Amendment.) That at the general election to be held on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November, 1908, the following provision be added to the Constitution of the State of Nebraska:

Section 9. (Educational Funds, Investment.) All funds belonging to the state for educational purposes, except the state university fund, shall be used, shall be deemed trust funds held by the state, and the state shall supply all the purposes for which they are granted and intended.

A JOINT RESOLUTION to amend Sections two (2), four (4), five (5), six (6) and thirteen (13) of Article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, relating to Judicial Powers.

Resolved and Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska:

Section 1. Amendment proposed. That Section two (2) of Article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended to read as follows:

Section 2. (Supreme court judges; jurisdiction.) The Supreme Court shall consist of seven (7) judges; and a majority of all elected and qualified judges shall be convened to constitute a quorum or pronounce a decision.
