Gives North Platte a Whack.

To The Tribune:—In a recent issue the "Boosters" for a new county building wail despairingly "North Platte is your county seat;" and that reminds me that it may be well for the people to look into the matter and see for themselves just how affairs political stand. The following offices are held by citizens of North Platte: Judge Thirteenth judicial district, court reporter, clerk of courts, lady assistant, deputy county clerk, copyist, county treasurer, lady assistant, county judge, county attorney, county surveyor, county coroner, county assessor, lady assistant, county sheriff, deputy sheriff, county commissioner second district, janitor county building.

The following are outsiders: "County clerk (?), county superintendent, deputy county treasurer.

How lonesome those three country men must feel! In addition to the above the register and receiver of the land office are citizens of North Platte. And though a large number of country people are patrons of the North Platte post office not only the postmaster but his five assistants are North Platters. If it were even thinkable that the Commercial Club could wrestle with a commercial problem the situation should appeal to them that the conditions are ripe not only for a hog market but for a packing house.

There are precincts in our county so large that residents therein are obliged to use more time in voting than fifty men in North Platte with the result that while North Platte has practically one-third the voters in the county she can dominate the nominations at any primary election. Last year there were three contests for republican nominations and North Platte modestly took them all. It is common talk that North Platte next year intends to retain all the offices she now holds and annex the other three.

In other lines it is the same story. The only semblance of a park in North Platte is the beautiful lawn around the county building, maintained by the whole county and used almost exclusively by North Platte.

A further recital is but cumulative evidence that North Platte is not only the county seat but that she is the whole county; and isn't it a fair proposition that if she wishes a new county building for the private use of his citizens she go right ahead and build just as fine a structure as she is willing to pay for.


