Florence Roberts Coming to North Platte.

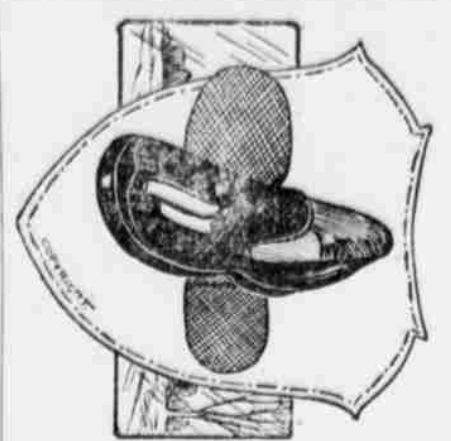


Scene from 'The House of Bondage'—Florence Roberts and Thurlow Burgen—at The Keith March 5th.
