It appears from the report of the Illinois Railroad and Warehouse commission that the 2-cent fare law has helped and not hurt the roads. Under this law their passenger revenue was \$2,000,000 larger in the depressed year of 1908 than in the prosperous year of 1907, while freight revenue fell off heavily.

IN THE last hours of the Nebraska legislature, a bill was passed limiting the hours in which saloons shall keep open from seven in the morning until eight in the evening. As might be expected this raised quite a protest from the saloon men and their friends, and especially from Omaha and South Omaha, who immediately wired the governor not to sign the bill until they could present their side of the proposition.
