In commenting on the guaranty deposit law which goes into effect July 1st, and comparing it with the similar law now in effect in Oklahoma, the Bee says: But here in Nebraska, instead of starting an exodus from the ranks of the national banks to get in on the guaranty fund, the first effect of the new law turns out to be just the reverse, and as a consequence all the largest state banks which would have been compelled to make the heaviest contributions to the guaranty fund have converted themselves into national banks, convinced that under the new arrangement the restrictions and limitations of the national banking law, although more severe than those of the state banking law, are still preferable for long established banks capitalized in excess of national banking requirements.
