Boosts Nebraska.

William E. Curtis, the noted correspondent of the Chicago Record-Herald, who recently spent some time in Nebraska, had the following letter in Sunday's edition of his paper:

It is evident that the people of Nebraska did not mind the recent panic, for during the year 1908 there were 17,990 farm mortgages paid off and canceled, representing a value of \$126,357,791, and 16,658 new farm mortgage were recorded, representing a value of \$36,432,657, leaving a tidy balance of about \$90,000,000 to the credit of prosperity.

In 1907 there were 17,541 mortgages recorded, representing a value of \$34,903,848, and 19,632, representing a value of \$26,881,000, canceled.

During the year 1908 the assessed value of improved farm property in the state was \$145,032,000, an increase shows the kidneys are mactive. from \$129,366,225 in 1907, which was very good for a panic year. During the same time the assessed value of unimproved farm property increased from 16,651,569 in 1907 to \$19,963,321 in

The population of Nebraska is now about 1,250,000, and the assessed wealth is \$345,365,818, an average of nearly \$279 per capita men, women and children.

The area of the state is about 50,000,000 acres, of which 35,000,000 are susceptible of cultivation, but only 2,178,773 are now under the plow. About 10,000,000 acres of the total area are semi-arid, but are capable of producing crops under the careful processes of dry farming or by irrigation.

During the last year Nebraska has advanced from the fourth to the third place in the list of corn producers, having passed Missouri by 2,000,000 bushels, and has advanced to the fourth place among the wheat producing

During the year i908, Nebraska produced 6,667,945 tons of hay, valued at \$41,308,437, as against 4,011,648 tons, valued at \$23,641,687, is 1907.

The alfalfa crop increased 20 per cent and the potato crop 32 per cent during the year, while the total value of all the farm crops of Nebraska advanced in value from \$170,519,767, in 1907, to \$213,480,998, in 1809.
