COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS.

August 18th, 1909. Board of equalization met pursuant to recess, present full board. Board not being quite ready to make levy takes a recess until tomorrow.

Adjoined until tomorrow August 19, 1909. Board of equalization met same as yesterday, present Commissioners Kocken, Springer and Walter, county Assessor Bacon and County Clerk Elliott.

The board proceeds to and did make the levy for the year 1909, as follows: County general fund 7 mills; County road fund 3 millia; Bridge fund 2 mills; Soldier's relief fund one-tenth mill; North Platte bridge three-tenth mill; Total county levy 12.4 mills.

PRECINCT BONDS. Brady Island bridge, no levy; Eureka bridge bond and interest six-tenth mill; Boatwick bridge bond and interest one-tenth mill; Hershey bridge bond and interest five-tenth mill; Birdwood bridge, no levy.

SCHOOL DISTRICT BONDS. Dist 29, five-tenth mills; Dist 60, no levy; Dist 1, old bond and interest two-tenth mills; Dist 1, new bond and interest two-tenth mills; Dist 98, seven-tenth mills; Dist 45, no levy; Dist 2, bond and interest seven-tenth mills; Dist 92, bond and interest one and six-tenths mills; Dist 55, three mills; Dist 118, twelve mills; Dist 36, three mills; Dist 105, eleven mills.

SPECIAL SCHOOL LEVIES. Levies were made for all school districts. The board having completed making the levy for the ensuing year, the board adjourned.

August 20th, 1909. Board of county commissioners met pursuant to adjournment, present full board and county clerk. Road petition presented to the board by Mrs. W. F. Cody and others asking that a public road be established on section line as follows: Commencing at a point being the end of road No. 120 south of the U. P. right-of-way on section line between sections 31 and 32, town 14, range 30, thence north about 85 rods, more or less, and terminating at and connecting therewith with road No. 308, said road to be 66 feet wide, the board being of the opinion that the public good requires it, the same is hereby granted as a consent road. The county surveyor is instructed to survey said road according to law.

Petition filed with county clerk for road between Lincoln and Logan counties. The petitioners having failed to file their petition also with Logan county, the board takes no action at the present time.
