Meyer, associated themselves together as a body corporate, under the name and style of the "Farmer's Independent Telephone Company." The principal place of transacting the business of said company shall be at the school house in School District No. 122, located on the Southeast 1 of Section 8, Township 13, North, of Range 31, West in Lincoln County, Nebraska.

The general nature of the business to be transacted shall be to construct, own, operate and maintain a main telephone line in Lincoln County, Nebraska, extending from Section 2, in Township 11, Range 33, in Lincoln County, Nebraska, to the City of North Platte, Nebraska, with lateral and branch lines and extensions of the main line, and for such purposes may own, lease, purchase, sell and convey such real estate as may be necessary or incident to the profitable and proper conducting of said business, and to do and perform such other acts and things as may be incident and necessary to the main powers of the corporation.

The date of the commencement of said corporation shall be the 1st day of December, 1909.
