Notice to Owners of Automobiles and Motorcycles.

Sec. 147. No person shall operate a motor vehicle on a public highway at a rate of speed greater than is reasonable and proper, having regard to the traffic and use of the highway or so as to endanger the life or limb of any person...

Sec. 149. (Brake-Signal-Light) Every motor vehicle while in use on a public highway shall be provided with a good and sufficient brake, and also with a suitable bell, horn or other signal...

Sec. 152 (Violations of Act) The violation of any of the provisions of this act shall be deemed a misdemeanor, punished by fine not exceeding twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for the first offense...

The above notices are sections 147, 149 and 152 of the Compiled Statutes of Nebraska which deal with Motor Vehicles and the way they shall be handled in cities, town and villages.

There are a great number of complaints being made about the way cars and vehicles are being run in the city, and the authorities are being censured for not enforcing the law along these lines...

All persons violating any of these sections will be prosecuted, so please try and be more careful in the future, as all police officers have orders to arrest any one found violating any of these sections.

Pensions for War Veterans.

More than 5,000 men who receive pensions for service during the civil war live outside of the United States. Some of the places to which pensions are sent are remote and far away.

Last year the government paid out \$160,998,000 to 951,000 surviving veterans and widows. Ohio and Pennsylvania lead, each state having 92,000 in round numbers. New York has 83,000, Illinois 68,000 and Indiana, 57,000 pensioners.

Canada leads in the foreign nations, with 2,631. Germany has 580, Ireland 460 and England 371. Other places to which money is sent are the Seychelles islands, St. Martins, St. Helena, Azores, Bahamas, Turkey, Greece, Liberia, Korea, Honduras, Isle of Man and Hong Kong.
