Kinkaid's Work in Congress.

A Washiegton special to the Bee says: "Legislation has been secured at this session affecting a large part of the great area of my district," said Representative Kinkaid. "In financial magnitude, the \$20,000,000 reclamation certificate or bond issue just passed sures anything else affecting my district. It is applicable to the uncompleted part of the North Platte project, of which there is a large acreage yet in Nebraska. A necessity, as well as a demand, has existed for some such legislation for some time, and I am confident constituents interested in the North Platte project will be pleased.
