Kinkaid's Work in Congress.

A Washington special to the Bee says: "Legislation has been secured at this session affecting a large part of the great area of my district," said Representative Kinkaid. "In financial magnitude, the \$20,000,000 reclamation certificate or bond issue just passed surpasses anything else affecting my district. It is applicable to the uncompleted part of the North Platte project, of which there is a large acreage yet in Nebraska. A necessity, as well as a demand, has existed for some such legislation for some time, and I am confident constituents interested in the North Platte project will be pleased.

"Another bill affecting the interests of homesteaders in perhaps half of the counties in my district is one, the provisions of which will result in securing to be expended for the resurvey of original surveys made many years ago, four times as much money as the law, as now written, permits. This new bill we secured to correct a mistake made as the result of a clerical error in an act which was passed a year ago. Already, in anticipation of the passage of this new bill, for which I have worked diligently for the last four months, I have secured to be apportioned for surveys in Nebraska \$20,000 for this year; and now that the new act is a certainty I am endeavoring to secure as much as \$10,000 more. My purpose is to secure a large amount of resurvey work to be done in my district this season.

"Next in importance, but of a local character, is the authorization I have secured in the omnibus public building bill, as a result of separate bills I introduced at the commencement of the session, for the purchase of a site, not to cost exceeding \$15,000 for a post-office and United States court building at Chadron, and for a site for a post-office, United States land office, and signal service station at Alliance, to cost not exceeding \$15,000. This means that these two promising cities in northwest Nebraska will in due time be granted money for handsome public buildings.

"I secured also \$15,000 to be appropriated for further development of the North Platte forest reserve over which there was a contest on the floor to the house.

"I have secured finally a favorable report on my bill for the relief of soldiers of the civil and Spanish-American wars, entitling the soldier homestead entryman for the time of his service in either war if his last discharge was honorable, though a previous discharge was not honorable. The final favorable report was made too late to secure the passage of the bill at this session, but I expect to pass it at the next session.

"I have secured pensions and increase of pensions for many worthy soldiers by private bills, besides many favor-

able decisions in the Bureau of Pensions I have supported the Roosevelt and Taft policies and legislative measures. In my efforts for legislation I have enjoyed the hearty and efficient cooperation of our Nebraska senators."

Careful investigation of the congressional record shows that the relative standing of Mr. Kinkaid for attendance during the session and answering to roll call is very high. A compilation and comparison of his vote with those of other members discloses that he ranks easily with the five or six members of the house whose records are the best as to the number of the votes they have expressed, including Mr. Mann, the acting censor of every bill which comes up for consideration, and the republican floor leader, Mr. Payne, whose duty it is to be present at all times to manage the parliamentary situation for the majority side.
