

There are now three candidates for the republican nomination for United States senator. First is Senator Burkett, who desires to succeed himself and is unquestionably deserving of a reelection; the second is Banker Wheedon, of Lincoln, who finds fault with everything done except what he does himself; and the third is Alf Sorenson, of Omaha, whose candidacy is the political joke of the year.

The democratic state convention to be held at Grand Island on July 26th promises to be a most spectacular affair. Arrayed on one side is Mr. Bryan and his county option adherents; on the other Governor Shallenberger and Congressman Hitchcock and their followers. The Omaha Bee is of the opinion that skeletons in the closets will be opened to view, and that personal questions relative to Governor Shallenberger's actions and tie-ups in the 1908 campaign will be asked.

A. E. Cady, of St. Paul, has filed as a candidate for governor, and his name will appear on the primary ballot. The Tribune regards Mr. Cady as one of the strongest men intellectually in the state of Nebraska; a successful business man, and though long associated with the republican party in Nebraska has ever proven himself a clean man politically.

Elsewhere B. K. Bushee, of Kimball, announces himself as a candidate for re-election as representative from this district. Mr. Bushee was a member of the legislature two years ago, and was active in advocating measures of interest to his constituents. One of the important questions that will come before the coming legislature will be a re-appointment of the state into senatorial and representative districts.

Ed Springer, of Brady, present chairman of the board of county commissioners, and for six years a member of that body, announces that he will be a candidate for re-nomination. That Mr. Springer has well served the county and the taxpayers must be admitted by all those who have taken an interest in county affairs; if he has displeased any it has been because where there are contending factions both cannot be pleased, but in each instance his vote or his decision has been for what he considered the best interests of all.
