

Providing for the extension of the main sewer on "A" street, from its present termination at a point where the center line of the alley of blocks 4, 5, 12 and 13 intersect said sewer on A street, extending said main sewer in a westerly direction, a distance of 1030 feet to a point opposite of and in line with the north and south center line of block 1 of South Park Addition to North Platta and to now for said extension Platte and to pay for said extension out of the sewer maintenance funds of said city, said extension to be of pipe 10 inches in diameter, providing for the estimate of cost thereof and for bids and for making a contract for said ex-

tension of main sewer.

Be it ordained by the mayor and city council of the city of North Platte, Ne-

Section 1. That an extension be made to the city's main sewer on A street, beginning at a point where the center line of the alley in blocks 4, 5, 12 and 13, Miller's Addition to North Platte, Nebraska, extended intersects the west end of the present main sewer in west A street, running thence west on west A street, 1030 feet to a point opposite of and in line with the north and south center line of block 1 of South Park Addition to North Platte.

Section 2. That said main sewer ex-tension be constructed of 10 inch sewer tension be constructed of 10 inch sewer pipe, laid at proper depth and on a grade required by the present sewer system of said city, to be constructed with the necessary man holes, flush tanks and necessary appliances along the line of said proposed main sewer

Section 3. That the engineer of said city at once prepare, and file with the clerk thereof, the estimate of the total cost of said main sewer extension and that said extension be paid for out of the sewer maintenance fund of said

city.
Section 4. That after said estimate is made and filed, as herein provided, that the clerk of said city proceed at once to advertise in manner and form required by law, for bids for the construction of said extension of said main

sewer, reserving to said city the right to reject any and all bids.

Section 5. If an approved bid be made for said work, that a contract be entered into by the mayor of said city, attested by the clerk, with the necessary provisions protection. A Big Snap.
