#### Two Jap Laborers Killed.

While employed on the work train at Dexter Saturday evening, two Jap laborers were killed, one instantly and the other dying a short time afterward.

At the time of the accident they were in the act of transferring rails from a car, by means of a hot air hoist to another car on a nearby track. A rail had been lifted and while yet suspended, became unbalanced and striking against the side of a car, swung around and striking the workmen with the ends hurled one of them with terrible force against the car, causing instant death and the other man was knocked to the ground causing injuries which resulted in his death shortly afterward.

The bodies were brought to the Ginn undertaking parlors in this city and an inquest held the following morning. All evidence show that the accident was due to the workmen not taking due caution of their own safety and not having in proper control the manipulation of the air hoist, thus exonerating all others from any blame or responsi-

The funeral was held from the Ginn undertaking parlors yesterday mornng and was attended by a large number of countrymen of the deceased. Interment was made in the North Platte cemetery.


