The Tickets as they Stand.

The tickets nominated by the republican and democratic mass convention have been shot to pieces by declinations on the part of a number of those nominated. Among those who declined were Keith Neville for mayor, Otten for clerk, Mothershead for police judge, Burke for school board, and Dickey, Herminhausen, VonGoetz and Payne for councilmen.

As a result of these declinations, the democrats have placed Patterson on their ticket for mayor and the republicans have substituted Temple for Otten as clerk, and both tickets will have Mooney for treasurer, Baker for police judge and Tramp and Ed Dickey for members of the board of education.

The candidates for councilmen on the two tickets are: Sullivan in the First; Crosby republican and Martini democrat in the Second, one to be elected; Brock for the long term and Clark Buchanan for the short term in the Third; and Douglas for the long term and Bowen for the short term in the Fourth. It will thus be seen that there is no opposition, so far as the two tickets are concerned, except in the Second ward.

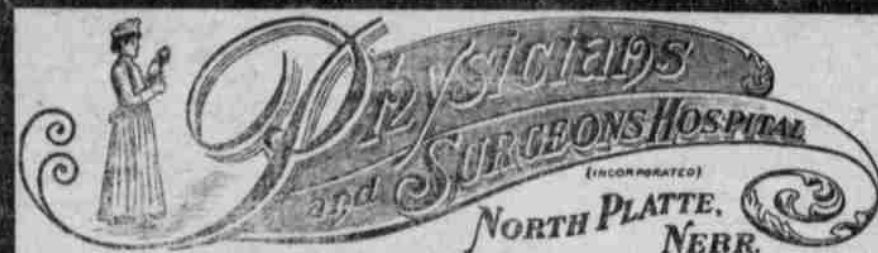
