The directors of the Chamber of Commerce held a meeting Wednesday evening and discussed the electrolier system of street lighting, better train service, and the irrigation convention to be held at Bridgeport this month. It was decided to ask the Union Pacific to run a special train to Northport in order to accommodate the delegates to the irrigation convention. It is expected that there will be thirty delegates from Lincoln county, and each county between here and Northport will send delegates.

Favor New Lighting System.

The committees having in charge better train service, the lighting system. and the south side irrigation proposition reported progress. These are matters that require considerable correspondence in order to secure the desired information. The Union Pacific has intimated that additional train service can be made to pay expenses. Prices for electrolier posts and the installation of the system are being obtained. 
