

FEW RULES OF MEASUREMENT

Second Foot Is Standard Unit for Flowing Water in Most of Irrigating States in West.

Refering to the units of water measurement the following is, in part, the definitions given by Prof. W. H. Olin, director of agricultural extension, Idaho university.

"The miners' inch is our oldest unit and was first used by the placer

"The second foot or cubic foot per second is the unit of volume used for time, it is called a second foot, or \$:12. cubic foot per second. A cubic foot of water in Colorado is 38.4 statute (miner's) inches; in California and Montana, 40; in Arizona, Idaho, Nevada and Utah, 50 statute or miner's inches.

"An acre foot is the amount of water necessary to cover an acre of land one foot or twelve inches deep. It is the unit used for measuring storage or reservoir water. A second foot of water running constantly twenty-four hours and twelve minutes delivers two acre feet, or sufficient water to cover had dizzy spells, my eyes puffed, an acre of ground with water two feet Jeep. The weir is used in Australia, India, Italy, Canada, Mexico and practically all irrigation districts of the United States. It is preferred by state engineers, who state that when this form is placed with care it is reliable within one per cent of error. Dams, when so designed as to cause the waters to flow over their crests, can be termed weirs."

"Ditch owners are required to install measuring devices and the state has stream gaugings made so the water commissioner may know the amount of water he has for his district distribution. The commissioner closes all gates according to decreed rights, in times of shortage, and it is a criminal offense in practically all states to change a headgate when once set by the water commissioner.

"The commissioner is further chargd with the duty of reporting statistical data, regarding irrigation, in his companies of a district have a water superintendent. He has personal supervision of all the main ditches or laterals which lead to the irrigated ands of all patrons of his company. maintenance, repair and cleaning of said canals and ditches, so that in the irrigating season they shall be carriers of water with least waste from loss and seepage possible. To users, he employs water measures. commonly known as 'ditch riders.' his amount of water, at the headgate of the lateral which controls the irrigation of his land, by the ditch rider. The ditch rider, in turn, receives his water from the district water commissioner, who turns it from the source stream."

Use Large Pipes.

One thing that every farmer should remember, and that is, when water is forced through a pipe, the faster it travels, the greater the loss in friction. This loss is equivalent to increasing the pumping head, hence it is better to use large pipes instead of the place which other things have small ones; it is also best to have as few turns or elbows as possible and it is simply a question which must be decided for each individual plant as to what sized pipe will be most economical. The larger the pipe the more it costs, and yet with large pipe the engine may be smaller and less fuel required to pump the required amount of water.
