

### One McPherson County Man Kills Another.

Word reached North Platte Saturday of a killing affray in McPherson county. As reported here H. F. Hiney and his neighbor, Harris, going home from Tryon, the county seat of McPherson county, overtook Charles Scheringer on foot, and offered him a ride. A few minutes later without any apparent reason, Scheringer attacked Hiney with some heavy instrument and jumped from the wagon trying to drag his victim out.

Harris belabored Scheringer with a buggy whip when Scheringer made a strong gun play, but did not shoot, and then fled.

Harris took Hiney home and found he was probably fatally injured. A doctor was called from Tryon and arrived several hours after Hiney's death.

Scheringer leaves a widow and small family, but they know nothing of his whereabouts. He has heretofore bore a good reputation. The victim was an old man and a highly respected citizen of McPherson county.

When the death of Hiney became known a posse was organized and a search instituted for Scheringer, but latest reports say he has not been apprehended. If found it is probable that he will be summarily dealt with.

### Many Homesteaders Make Final Proof.

During the month of April final proof was made on 43,100 acres of land in the North Platte land district, the entries on which proof was made averaging about 425 acres each. Patents or deeds for this land will be received from the general land office at Washington within the next few months, and the 100 or more homesteaders who submitted their proofs will come into full ownership of the land.

While practically all the vacant land remaining in the district is in small tracts, yet during April entries were made on 4,978 acres. However, a considerable portion of these entries were made through the relinquishment of the former entrymen.

About one-third of the North Platte forest reserve which is to be opened for settlement in October lies in the North Platte district. The total acreage of the reserve is somewhat in excess of 300,000 acres, so the opening will throw into this district about 100,000 acres. If the 640-acre law applies in this opening, which is probable, there will be 150 or 160 full section entries. However, it is not probable that each entry made will be a full section.

#### Lexington Garage Sells Cheap.

The liabilities amounted to about \$12,000 while the assets, according to Mr. Bancroft's statement, footed up to the neighborhood of \$17,000. The transfer of the property to the bank will go through if the sale is confirmed by the court.—Lexington Pioneer.
