An Ordinance No 30.

Providing for the construction of a sewer lateral district, to be known as Extension to Sewer Lateral District , to consist of Blocks Nos. 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 of the Town Lot Company's Addition to said city of North Platte, Nebraska; said sewer lateral beginning where the center line of the alley in Block 123 of the original town intersects the present sewer lateral in anid block 'running thence in a westerly direction on the center line of the alley in said Blocks 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12, to where the center line of said alley intersects with the west line of said Block 12, there to terminate; to be con-structed of ten inch sewer pipe, with proper flush tanks, man holes and pro-per appliances; Providing for an estimate of the cost thereof and for bids and making contracts for said sewer laterals; also providing for levying against the abutting lots, along the line of said lateral sewer, a special assess-ment to pay the cost of constructing the same.

Be it ordained by the mayor and city council of North Platte, Nebraska:

Sec. 1. That a sewer lateral district, to be known as Extension to Sewer Lateral District "M" be formed from Blocks 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 of the Town Lot Company's Addition to the city of North Platte, Nebraska.


