Union Pacific Appeals Huxoll Case.

The Union Pacific company has appealed to the supreme court from a judgment secured in the Lancaster county district court two weeks ago by Mrs. Ella Huxoll, of this city, administratrix of the estate of Fred Huxoll, her husband, who was killed by a switch engine in the Sidney yards.

This is the first case tried under the federal law in this state and it is believed, no matter what the decision of the supreme court, will be carried through the courts to the highest tribunal in the land in order to test its constitutionality.

Assess Damage at \$750.

In the damage case of Arvid Norgren against Harry Dixon for personal injuries sustained in an automobile accident which occurred a little over a year ago, the jury brought in a verdict of \$750. The judgment carries the cost of suit. The trial occupied two days in the district court, the jury retiring about five o'clock Saturday evening and returning a sealed verdict at night, which was opened when court convened yesterday morning. The plaintiff sued for \$15,000.
