Franchise Carries and Saloons Win Out.

With the gas franchise and "wet" or "dry" the issue, North Platte Tuesday polled the heaviest vote ever cast in the city, exceeding by 300 votes the normal number in city elections. While this vote was so unusually heavy, there was not much excitement; of course the voters were hustled out, but there were few disputes and no attractions.

The vote on the franchise came as a surprise, as the opinion was prevalent that it would fail to carry. The change in sentiment toward the franchise was strong during the week preceding election, due to personal efforts of the electric light people and citizens who efficiently interested themselves to get out and work. The publication of the construction placed on the franchise by the interested company also tended to create a favorable sentiment.

The vote on the franchise was 152 greater than on the saloon issue. This discrepancy was due largely to indifference on the part of the voters, and had these votes been cast it is not likely the result would have been changed. It is fair to presume that this vote would have been equally divided on the issue. The vote, however, shows an increase in the sentiment against the saloon as compared with the last time it was brought to an issue. This is due to the fact that the anti-saloon element was better organized than ever before.

An Ordinance No. 45.

Providing for the construction of a sewer lateral district to be known as sewer lateral district "D", to consist of blocks Nos. 4, 5, 12 and 13 of Penniston's Addition and block 4 of Taylor's Addition to said city of North Platte, Nebraska: Said sewer lateral beginning where the center line of the alley in said block 4, Penniston's Addition intersects the main sewer in said block running thence in a southerly direction on the center line of the alley in said blocks 4, 5, 12, and 13 of Penniston's Addition and block 4 of Taylor's Addition, to where the center line of said alley intersects with the south line of said block 4, Taylor's Addition, there to terminate; to be constructed of ten inch sewer pipe with proper flush tanks, man-holes and proper appliances; Providing for an estimate of the cost thereof and for bids and making contracts for said sewer laterals; also providing for levying against the abutting lots, along the line of said lateral sewer, a special assessment to pay the costs of constructing the same.

Be it ordained by the mayor and city council of North Platte, Nebraska:

Section 1. That a sewer lateral district, to be known as Sewer Lateral District "D", to be formed from blocks 4, 5, 12 and 13 of Penniston's Addition and block 4 of Taylor's Addition to the city of North Platte, Nebraska.

Section 2. That a sewer lateral be constructed of ten inch sewer pipe at a proper depth and on a level required by the present sewer system of said city, beginning where the center line of the alley in said block 4 Penniston's Addition intersects the main sewer in said block running thence in a southerly direction on the center line of the alley in said blocks 4, 5, 12 and 13 of Penniston's Addition and block 4 of Taylor's Addition, to where the center line of said alley intersects with the south line of said block 4, Taylor's Addition, there to terminate; to be constructed of ten inch sewer pipe with proper flush tanks, man-holes and proper appliances; Providing for an estimate of the cost thereof and for bids and making contracts for said sewer laterals; also providing for levying against the abutting lots, along the line of said lateral sewer, a special assessment to pay the costs of constructing the same.

Be it ordained by the mayor and city council of the city of North Platte, Nebraska:

Section 1. That a sewer lateral district, to be known as sewer lateral district "J", to be formed from blocks 32, 33, 34, in said city of North Platte, Nebraska: Said sewer lateral beginning where the center line of the alley in block 35 intersects the main sewer in said block running thence in a westerly direction on the center line of the alley in said blocks 34, 33, 32, to where the center line of said alley intersects with the west line of said block 32, there to terminate. To be constructed of ten inch sewer pipe with proper flush tanks, man-holes and proper appliances; Providing for an estimate of the cost thereof and for bids and making contracts for said sewer lateral; Also providing for levying against the abutting lots along the line of said lateral sewer a special assessment to pay the costs of constructing the same.

Be it ordained by the mayor and city council of the city of North Platte, Nebraska:

Section 1. That a sewer lateral district, to be known as sewer lateral district "J", to be formed from blocks 32, 33 and 34 of the city of North Platte, Nebraska.

Section 2. That a sewer lateral be constructed of ten inch sewer pipe at a proper depth and on a level required by the present sewer system of said city, beginning where the center line of the alley in block 35 intersects the main sewer in said block running thence in a westerly direction on the center line of the alley in said blocks 34, 33, 32, to where the center line of said alley intersects with the west line of said block 32, there to terminate with proper flush tank and appliances; said district to be formed and said sewer to be constructed in all respects in conformity with the system of sewerage heretofore adopted by said city of North Platte and in pursuance to a general ordinance regulating the construction of such sewers.

Section 3. That the engineer of said city at once prepare and file with the clerk thereof, an estimate of the total costs of said proposed sewer lateral.

Section 4. That after said estimate is made and filed, as herein provided, the clerk of said city shall proceed at once to advertise in manner and form required by law for bids for the construction of said sewer lateral and appliances, reserving to said city the right to reject any or all bids therefore.

Section 5. If an approved bid be made for said work, that a contract thereof be entered into by the mayor of said city, attested by the clerk, with the necessary provisions protecting the interests of said city, upon the contractor furnishing a bond in a sufficient amount for the faithful performance of said contract.

Section 6. To pay the costs of the construction of said sewer lateral, flush tanks, man-holes and appliances, a special assessment shall be levied, according to law, against the lots abutting on the line of said lateral.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval and publication.

An Ordinance No. 46.

Providing for the construction of a sewer lateral district to be known as sewer lateral district "C", to consist of blocks Nos. 3, 6, 11, and 14 of Penniston's Addition and block 6 of Taylor's Addition to said city of North Platte, Nebraska:

Section 1. That a sewer lateral be constructed of ten inch sewer pipe at a proper depth and on a level required by the present sewer system of said city, beginning where the center line of the alley in block 3 of Penniston's Addition intersects the main sewer in said block running thence in a southerly direction on the center line of the alley in said blocks 3, 6, 11 and 14 of Penniston's Addition and block 6 of Taylor's Addition, to where the center line of said alley intersects with the south line of said block 6 in Taylor's Addition, there to terminate; to be constructed of ten inch sewer pipe with proper flush tanks, man-holes and proper appliances; Providing for an estimate of the cost thereof and for bids and making contracts for said sewer laterals; also providing for levying against the abutting lots, along the line of said lateral sewer, a special assessment to pay the costs of constructing the same.

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Be it ordained by the mayor and city council of the city of North Platte, Nebraska:

Section 1. That a sewer lateral district, to be known as sewer lateral district "C", to be formed from blocks 3, 6, 11, and 14 of Penniston's Addition and block 6 of Taylor's Addition to the city of North Platte, Nebraska.

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
