

**Methodist Brotherhood
Talks City Playgrounds**

The proposition for public city playgrounds received new impetus Tuesday evening when the men's brotherhood of the Methodist church took up the proposition and discussed it in open meeting. They also appointed a committee, consisting of Wilson Toot and I. A. Gilbert, to meet with the other brotherhoods of the city and make definite plans.

The plans as discussed related more to the boys' athletics and playgrounds to afford them athletic training. This committee that was appointed is to confer with the other men of the city in regard to plans and a site for the building. As soon as anything can be done the plans are to hire an experienced man to take charge of the physical training of the boys and give them systematic training. The idea has been discussed from various angles by the different organizations of the city and was first taken up by the women of the Twentieth Century club. The different brotherhoods of the have taken up the matter, but heretofore nothing definite has been done.

A large attendance was present at the brotherhood meeting, which was held at the home of Mr. and Mrs. I. A. Gilbert. The men were all enthusiastic over the idea of the playgrounds and boy athletics and a fine meeting was held. After the discussion, the men spent an hour in social converse and a general good time and at a late hour nice refreshments were served.

Sprague Bond Over to District Court.

Joseph Sprague, who was arrested last week upon complaint of Sheriff Salisbury on the charge of fornication, was brought before Judge Grant yesterday morning to answer the charge. He entered a plea of not guilty, but the court found sufficient evidence to bind him over to the district court and fixed his bonds at \$800. He was unable to furnish bonds and was remanded to jail to await trial.

Sprague was arrested with a woman who later gave her name as Mrs. Myrtle Gowins. Mrs. Gowins testified that they had lived together for over two years and that they had never been married, but they had agreed to live together as man and wife. They began living together in Greeley, Colo., and later moved to Oshkosh where they lived until about six weeks ago when they came to this city. Both testified that under the laws of the state of Colorado they were legally man and wife.

Another witness, Miss Lena Corner, was called and she testified that Sprague had lived with her mother for nine years without ever having been married and that they had two children. She alleged that Sprague then deserted her mother and then lived with her sister for several months. On the witness stand Sprague testified that he had lived with the girl's sister but that he did not marry her on account of her being under age. He also testified to having lived with another woman, and stated that he had never been married. His case will come up for hearing at the next term of district court.
