Still Searches for Lost Brother

Mr. and Mrs. H. G. Connett, of Chillicothe, Ill., arrived in the city yesterday, continuing the search for Mr. Connett's brother, Vernon Connett, who disappeared last August. Mr. Connett announces that within the past few days he has unearthed more evidence against Roberts and that they are certain that the brother was murdered.

Roberts is still being held at the penitentiary and as soon as it is deemed advisable will be given a preliminary hearing. His letter to "Derald Louder" still remains unanswered and will probably be returned here in the course of time, a ten days return was marked on the letter and it will be returned here unless called for.

During the district court session the local officers are so busy that they have no time to devote to the case, but the relatives of the missing man and the prison authorities are still keeping an outlook for any evidence that may arise. The cold weather stopped the search for the body but it will be resumed again as soon as the weather permits. Inquiries have been sent to all towns along the Platte river below to ascertain if there are any unidentified bodies that were taken from the river. So far nothing of any consequence has been heard from these sources.
