Initial Poultry Exhibit Will Be Great Success.

From all indications the first annual poultry and pet stock show, which will begin Thursday and last three days, will be a fine one and there will be a large number of exhibitors. The show is given by the Lincoln County Poultry & Pet Stock association and is the first of its kind to be held here.

The exhibits will be in the old McKay store on Dewey street and already a number of people from over the state have signed up to enter their birds. There will be exhibits here from Omaha, Grand Island, Hastings, Lexington and from many other towns out side of Lincoln county as well as from all parts of the county. A competent, registered judge has been engaged to judge the entries and award the premiums.

The association is putting up an exceptionally attractive premium list and one that is attracting many fanciers from over the state. The merchants of this city as well as from neighboring towns have contributed liberally to help make this first show a success and each of the banks of this city is offering a silver loving cup as a premium.

It is hoped that many from the country will attend and that this will be only the beginning of an association that will grow and be a credit to Lincoln county. The membership of the association is growing and will probably grow more each year. Many will probably join during the show when they realize what an organization of this nature means. The admission to the show is free and all are urged to come and bring their families. Everybody boost for the good of the association and the benefits it will bring to Lincoln county.

Robinson Wins in Election Contest.

The case of John Wing, contestant, vs. Charles Robinson, a case contesting the election of road overseer in Hall precinct, road district No. 30, was decided last week in favor of the defendant by County Judge Grant in the county court. The case was tried some time ago and the court took it under advisement for a few days.

This case has been watched with much interest over the county. At the fall election the election board in Hall precinct canvassed the votes and gave Robinson seventeen and Wing sixteen. Wing alleged that the vote should be the other way and when the canvassing board upheld the count of the election board he brought the case into the county court, asking that the court reverse the count. The case was argued and after deliberation Judge Grant handed down an elaborate decision in favor of the defendant and taxed the costs on Wing, the contestant.

A count of the ballots was made by the court with the result that he granted Robinson eleven legal votes and Wing eight. Wing received in all sixteen votes but in some instances the elector had neglected to put a cross after the name which he had written in, making the ballot void on that candidate. Robinson got a total of fifteen votes and there was also a vote for "Robinson" which had no initials written in for identification and one for "Robins." In all eleven votes were written for Robinson and were duly witnessed with a mark in the square which is required by law.

Mrs. Mary Ann Ell Dies

Mrs. Mary Ann Ell, a resident of this city since 1869, died Saturday morning at 3:15 at her home on west Third street. She was eighty-nine years and twenty-three days of age at the time of her death which was due to paralysis from which she had been suffering for several days.

Mrs. Ell was born in Bavaria, Germany, December 10th, 1825. In her early girlhood she came to America where she was married before the war to John Paul Ell at Columbus, Ohio. In 1849 Mr. Ell was mustered out of the United States army at Omaha after a number of years of service and they moved to this city. Since that time Mrs. Ell had made her home here.

Mrs. Ell leaves to mourn her death a large circle of warm friends and one son, Engineer Charles Ell, of this city. Mr. Ell died January 7, 1881 at Currys, Nebraska. Mrs. Ell had been a constant worker in the Presbyterian church and the funeral will be held from there. The deceased was stricken only a few days before her death with paralysis and although her friends knew she was well advanced in years, her death came as a surprise.

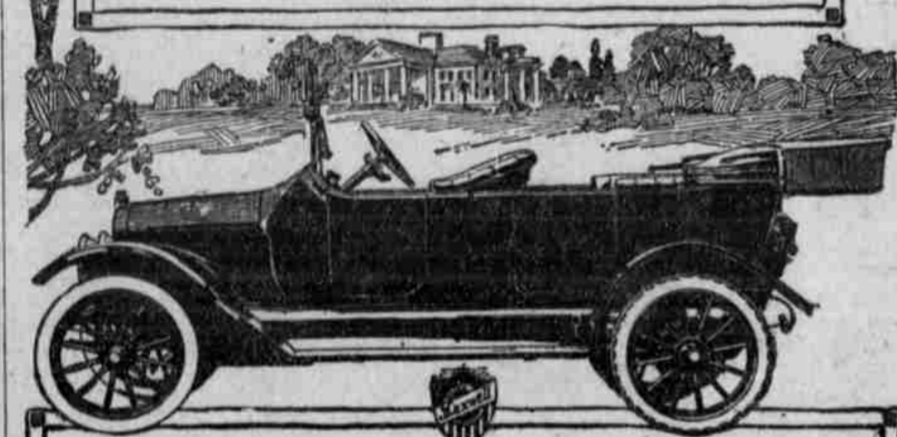

NEIGHBORHOOD NEWS

Garden county will receive \$2,420 from the state school funds this year to aid weak school districts in the county.

A petition is being circulated calling for a special election in Deuel county to vote \$20,000 for a new court house at Chappell.

J. H. Wehn and associates, who have a number of banks in the North Platte valley, will open a new bank at Bridgeport in the course of a few weeks.

E. A. Robinson, county treasurer of Banner county, who disappeared November 20th, has been found \$729.71 short in his accounts by the state examiner.

The city council of Alliance has asked Governor Morehead to proclaim that town a city of the first class. The census of the city just completed shows a population of 5,140.

The Burlington is shipping sixty cars of ice per day from the lake at Maywood. In past years it was difficult to get laborers, but this year there are two or three applications for every man needed.

Two young men named Pitts and Sampson have been arrested at Sidney on the charge of being implicated in the theft of twenty-eight head of horses belonging to Ed Fischer and John Gillespie.

Steve Tuckahoe, who was sent to the penitentiary for stealing from Greeks at Oshtosh, writes that the pen is a better place than he thought. His cell is furnished with a rug on the floor, lace curtains, writing desk and a good bed.

The county treasurer of McPherson county is calling in and paying all the county warrants issued prior to January, 1912, and on which the county was paying a yearly interest of \$240. The county is still a year behind in the payment of its claims.

The Holloway brothers drilled another test well for oil near Tryon last week but failed to strike the oil bearing sand which they encountered when boring a well last fall. This well was put down within twelve feet of the place the other well had been bored. The Holloways, however, are not discouraged, and will make several more attempts to find the oil bearing sand.

E. T. Dalton, a bum, floated into town on Monday and stole a number of tools from the U. P. pump house and sold them to Jay Hollingsworth and while making this sale he stole a box of cigars from Jay and sold them to one of the pool halls, he then hopped a train for North Platte. Jay followed him to that place and had him arrested. Sheriff Beal brought him back. He was arraigned before Judge Buchanan who gave him ten days and costs in the county jail.—Ogallala News.
