The most important cases will probably come to hearing and some of those that are of minor importance.

Of these cases probably the most prominent one scheduled is the case of the state of Nebraska vs. Roy Roberts, charged with homicide. On account of the complications that have recently arisen the case will probably be left over to another term. Hearing on the case against Charles Clayton, who is charged with complicity, is yet to be had in the county court.
