COMMITTEE MAKES REPORT ON STREET LIGHTING.

E. R. Goodman, chairman of the special committee appointed to investigate street lighting conditions...

The system now proposed is to discard the arc lights, and substitute therefore fourteen incandescent lights of 250 candle power each.

In the residential districts 126 sixty-power lights would be maintained. This would be the same number as now in operation.

The price of the 250-candle power lights would be \$58 per year and of the 60-candle \$21 per year.

The committee had investigated the plan of buying the current from the company at a metre rate and operating the lights as a municipality.

The lighting committee, the special committee and the city attorney were asked to meet and draft a contract with the electric company.

Council Notes.

Hershey Welch was named as plumbing inspector by the mayor and the nomination was confirmed.

The popcorn stands on the corner of Dewey and Front and Dewey and Sixth were ordered removed from the present locations.
