Prairie Dog Poison.

(Formula used by the federal experts in Wyoming and copied from the Daily Drovers Journal Stockman.) Here is the formula used by the government experts in killing prairie dogs, resulting in the extermination of as high as 90 per cent of the animals from the first spreading of the poison and practically wiping out large towns with the second spreading.

Thirteen quarts oats, 1 ounce strychnine, 1 ounce baking soda, 2 tablespoons gloss starch, 1 tablespoon corn syrup, 1-8 ounce saccharine, 1 pint water.

Dissolve strychnine in water and bring to boil.

Dissolve starch in small amount of water separate from strychnine.

Dissolve soda in small amount of water separately.

After strychnine boils, add starch until cooked.

Take from fire; add soda slowly; then add syrup and saccharine.

Pour mixture over oats and stir thoroughly.

Large dog towns in this vicinity have been completely wiped out with this poison, which costs about 6 cents an acre. A visit to one of the large dog towns near here a few days after the poison had been put out, discovered but one lone prairie dog, where time ordinarily fifty could be seen at any time of day.
