ORDINANCE NO. 65.

Providing for the submission to the voters of the City of North Platte, Nebraska, of a proposition authorizing the Mayor and Council of said

City, to borrow money and pledge the property and credit of said City upon its negotiable bonds to an amount not exceeding Sixteen Thousand Dollars to be used for the payment of the cost of paving the intersections of streets and spaces opposite alleys in paving districts in said City, and to levy a tax, annually, on the taxable property of the City, in addition to all other taxes, sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds and to create a sinking fund for the payment of said bonds when they become due; calling a special election for the purpose; and appointing clerks and judges for said special election.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of North Platte, Nebraska.

SECTION 1. A special election is hereby called to be held in the City of North Platte, Nebraska, on the 31st day of August, A. D. 1915 at the places hereinafter specified in the several wards of the city, for the purpose of enabling the voters of the City having the legal right so to do, to vote upon the following proposition, to-wit:

Shall the Mayor and Council of the City of North Platte, Nebraska, have power and be authorized to borrow money and pledge the property and credit of the City upon its negotiable bonds to the amount not exceeding Sixteen Thousand Dollars to be used in paying the cost of paving the intersections of streets and spaces opposite alleys in paving districts in said City, and levy a tax, annually, upon the taxable property of said City, in addition to all other taxes, sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds and to create a sinking fund sufficient to pay said bonds when they become due and payable at their maturity?

SECTION 2. The bonds proposed by the preceding section shall draw interest at the rate of not to exceed 5 per cent per annum from their date until paid, which interest shall be payable semi-annually and be evidenced by coupons to said bonds attached. Said bonds shall be drawn payable to the bearer twenty years after date but redeemable at the option of the City ten years after the date thereof. Said bonds shall be issued a such time and bear such date as the Mayor and Council may by resolution direct, and said bonds and interest coupons thereon shall be payable at the office of the state treasurer in the City of Lincoln, Nebraska.

SECTION 3. It shall be the duty of the Mayor and the City Clerk acting for and on behalf of the City to sign and attest said bonds and affix the seal of the said city thereto, and the coupons attached to said bonds shall be signed by the City Clerk without seal.

SECTION 4. Before negotiating said bonds the Mayor and Council shall advertise for bids for the sale thereof in such manner as they may deem best. Such notice shall reserve the right to reject any and all bids, and the bonds shall be sold to the highest responsible bidder for cash but in no case below their par value; and in case the proceedings above provided in this section shall not result in a satisfactory sale of said bonds on the date, in said notice provided, then and in that case the Mayor and Council may proceed to negotiate and sell said bonds at public or private sale, in such manner as they may consider for the best interest of the city.

SECTION 5. The proceeds of the sale of said bonds shall be paid to the treasurer of said city, and shall be by him placed to the credit of the "Paving Bond Fund" and said bonds shall be described as "Paving Bonds of the City of North Platte, Nebraska."

SECTION 6. The polls at such special election shall be kept open between the hours of 9 o'clock A. M. and 7 o'clock P. M., of said day, and the voting places for said election shall be as follows, to-wit: First ward at the Lloyd Opera House. Second ward in the Commissioners' room at the Court House of Lincoln County, Nebraska.

SECTION 7. The ballots voted at said special election shall be in accordance with the form prescribed in the Australian Ballot Law, and shall have printed thereon the proposition as embodied in sections one and two of this ordinance, with the words "yes" and "no" properly arranged adjacent thereto for the expression of the will of the voter, and should a majority of the votes cast at such election upon said proposition be in favor of said proposition, then the same shall be considered adopted, and the Mayor and Council shall have power and be authorized to issue said bonds and levy such taxes for the purpose and upon the terms and conditions above specified.

SECTION 8. There shall be three judges and two clerks appointed by the Mayor and council for each polling place who shall perform the duties of such election usually devolving upon judges and clerks at election for city officers. The returns of said election shall be made to the Mayor and Council of said City of North Platte, and by them canvassed and the result determined and declared at their first meeting after said election. Such judges and clerks for above, are hereby designated and appointed, as follows, viz:

In the first ward, for clerks, A. A. Schatz and J. E. Sebastian. In the first ward for judges, P. H. Sullivan, Wm. Maloney and J. T. Keefe.

In the second ward for clerks, Ernest Rincker and Wm. Baldock. In the second ward for judges, J. V. Vosepka, Geo. Donehower and A. Bulard.

In the third ward, for clerks, A. B. Horgland and Fred Dick. In the third ward for judges, A. O. Kocken, John Boyer and S. Hartman.

In the fourth ward, for clerks, Henry Westenfeldt and A. W. Hughes. In the fourth ward for judges, Theo. Lowe, Sr., Richard Owens and John Canright.

SECTION 9. Notice of said election and of the proposition submitted shall be given by publication in the North Platte Semi-Weekly Tribune and North Platte Telegraph for five successive weeks, commencing with Tuesday,

July 27th, 1915. SECTION 10. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication. Passed and approved this 20th day of July, A. D. 1915.

ORDINANCE NO. 64.

An Ordinance Defining and Naming the Sewer Limits of the City of North Platte, Nebraska, and prohibiting the maintenance or use of water closets or privies with open vaults or cess pools or not having sewerage connections with the sewerage system of the City of North Platte, Nebraska; Declaring same to be a nuisance; Providing a penalty for the violation hereof; and repealing all of Ordinance Number 29 and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of North Platte, Nebraska.

SECTION 1. That all of the City of North Platte, Nebraska, is and the same is hereby declared to be in the sewer limits of said City for the purpose of this ordinance.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, that controls, owns, occupies or is in possession of any premises within the City of North Platte, Nebraska, which same is adjacent to or accessible to the sewer system of said City to permit any water closet or privy with an open vault or cess pool or not having sewerage connections with said sewerage system of said City to be upon, maintained, or used on said premises by any person whomsoever.

SECTION 3. In all places within the City of North Platte wherein the sewerage system exists or is extended, all water closets or privies with open vaults or cess pools or not having sewerage connections with the sewerage systems of said City, are hereby declared to be a nuisance and every person, firm or corporation that owns, controls or is in possession of said premises on which said water closet, privy or cess pool is located, is guilty of maintaining a nuisance and shall be punished as is provided in this ordinance.

SECTION 4. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not to exceed \$100.00 thereof and shall stand committed until such fine and costs are paid.

SECTION 5. All of Ordinance Number 29 and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are, and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law. Passed and approved this 20th day of July, 1915.

ORDINANCE NO. 63.

An ordinance repealing all of Ordinance Number 48, same being an ordinance regulating the operation and location of peanut and popcorn wagons within the City of North Platte, Nebraska.

Be it Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of North Platte, Nebraska:

SECTION 1. That all of Ordinance Number 48, being an ordinance regulating the operation and location of peanut and popcorn wagons within the City of North Platte, Nebraska, and providing a license fee and providing a penalty for the violation thereof, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 62.

An ordinance providing for the submitting to the electors of the City of North Platte, County of Lincoln, State of Nebraska, the following question: "Shall the City of North Platte, in the County of Lincoln, State of Nebraska, issue its 'City of North Platte Bonds' in the sum of twelve thousand and 00/100 (\$12,000.00) dollars, for the purpose of raising money to purchase from William W. Birge, trustee, and hold in the name of the City of North Platte, in the County of Lincoln, in the State of Nebraska, the following land, lot and parcel of ground lying adjacent to said City of North Platte, to-wit: All that part of the southeast quarter (SE 1/4) of section twenty-eight (28) in township fourteen (14) north, of range thirty (30) west of the 5th P. M., lying north of the main road running north along said tract, which road is an extension of Locust street in said City, to be used and improved for parks and parkways, and to provide for the levying and collecting by the proper officers of said city, a tax annually, to pay the interest and principal of said bonds as they mature?"

Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the City of North Platte, in the County of Lincoln, in the State of Nebraska:

SECTION 1. That a special election shall be held in said City of North Platte, in the County of Lincoln, in the State of Nebraska, on the 31st day of August, 1915, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted to the voters of said City:

Shall the Mayor and City Council of the City of North Platte, in the County of Lincoln, in the State of Nebraska, issue Twelve Thousand 00/100 (\$12,000.00) dollars 'City of North Platte Park Bonds' in denominations of Two Thousand 00/100 (\$2,000.00) Dollars each, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable annually, the interest and principal payable at the office of the State

Treasurer of the State of Nebraska? Said bonds to bear date of September 1, 1915, and the interest on said bonds, to be payable on the 1st day of September, 1916, and on the first day of September of each and every year thereafter, until all of the interest on said bonds shall have been paid.

Said bonds to be numbered consecutively from one to six inclusive, and the interest thereon to be evidenced by coupons thereon attached.

Bond number one to become due and payable on the 1st day of September, 1920.

Bond number two to become due and payable on the 1st day of September, 1921.

Bond number three to become due and payable on the 1st day of September, 1922.

Bond number four to become due and payable on the 1st day of September, 1923.

Bond number five to become due and payable on the 1st day of September, 1924.

Bond number six to become due and payable on the 1st day of September, 1925.

Shall the Mayor and City Council of the City of North Platte, in the County of Lincoln, in the State of Nebraska, levy a tax in the year 1915, and in each and every year thereafter sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds; and in the year 1919 and in each and every year thereafter sufficient to pay the principal on said bonds as they become due, until sufficient tax has been levied to pay all of the principal of said bonds; and such tax both for principal and interest to be levied upon all of the taxable property in said City of North Platte?

Said bonds to be used for the purpose of raising money to purchase from William W. Birge, Trustee, and hold in the name of the City of North Platte, in the County of Lincoln, in the State of Nebraska, the following land, lot and parcel of ground, lying adjacent to said City of North Platte, to-wit: All that part of the southeast quarter (SE 1/4) of section twenty-eight (28) in township fourteen (14) north, of range thirty (30) west of the 5th P. M., lying south of the North Platte river, and east of the main road running north along said tract, which road is an extension of Locust street in said City, to be used and improved for parks and parkways.

SECTION 2. The ballots to be used at said election shall have printed thereon:

For issuing of Twelve thousand 00/100 (\$12,000.00) Dollars 'City of North Platte Park Bonds', in denominations of Two thousand 00/100 (\$2,000.00) Dollars each, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable annually, interest and principal payable at the office of the State Treasurer of the State of Nebraska, said bonds to bear date of September 1st, 1915, and the interest on said bonds shall be payable on the 1st day of September of each and every year thereafter until all of the interest on said bonds shall have been paid; to levy a tax in the year 1915, and each and every year thereafter sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds, and in the year 1919 and in each and every year thereafter sufficient to pay the principal of said bonds as they become due, until sufficient tax has been levied to pay all of the principal and interest to be levied upon all of the taxable property in said City of North Platte.

Against issuing of Twelve thousand 00/100 (\$12,000.00) Dollars 'City of North Platte Park Bonds', in denominations of Two thousand 00/100 (\$2,000.00) Dollars each, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable annually, interest and principal payable at the office of the State Treasurer of the State of Nebraska, said bonds to bear date of September 1st, 1915, and the interest on said bonds shall be payable on the 1st day of September of each and every year thereafter until all of the interest on said bonds shall have been paid; to levy a tax in the year 1915, and each and every year thereafter sufficient to pay the principal of said bonds as they become due, until sufficient tax has been levied to pay all of the principal and interest to be levied upon all of the taxable property in said City of North Platte.

SECTION 3. Those voting in favor of said proposition shall mark their ballots with an X after the paragraph beginning with the word "FOR"; and those voting against said proposition shall mark their ballot with an X after the paragraph beginning with the word "AGAINST".

SECTION 4. Notice of said election shall be given by the publication of a notice in the North Platte Telegraph, and in the North Platte Semi-Weekly Tribune, the former a weekly newspaper, and the latter a semi-weekly newspaper, both published in the City of North Platte, Lincoln County, Nebraska, and of general circulation in said County of Lincoln, as said papers have been designated as official papers of said City; said notice shall be published for at least four weeks prior to said election; and the City Clerk is hereby instructed to cause the publication of such notice to be made.

SECTION 5. Said election will be open at 9 o'clock in the morning and will continue to be open until 7 o'clock in the afternoon of said day of election. The polling places of said election will be at the entrance of the old Lloyd Opera House on the corner of 4th and 6th streets, in the first ward of said City; and at the County Commissioners' room in the second ward of said City; and at the old hose house, situated on Vine street between Front and Sixth streets in the third ward of said City; and at the hose house in the fourth ward of said City; said election will be conducted in manner and form as provided by the ordinance of said City, and the Statutes of the State of Nebraska.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval and publication as required by law.
