conditions: 2.-For sixty candle power incandes cent lamps or their equivalent in candle power, each per annum \$21.00; for eighty candle power incandescent lamps or their equivalent in candle power, each per annum \$23.75; for one hundred power incandescent lamps or their equivalent in candle power, each per annum \$26,50, for two hundred and fifty candle power incandescent lamps or their equivalent in candle power, each per annum \$58.00; for four hundred candle power incandescent lamps or their equivalent in candle power, each per annum \$82.50; for thirty-two candle power incandescent lamps as specified and provided for in Para-
