The late season was detrimental to the best display of corn, which is Lincoln county's principal crop. However, there was an abundance of corn stalks bearing immense ears in the "roasting" stage, which gave evidence of a heavy yield if early frost does not

There was a large display of apples and plums, and pears. The exhibit of apples gave evidence that this fruit can be most successfully raised in Lincoln county. Especially fine was the showing made by the Greenburnie fruit farm and from the orchards of Hinman precinct.

In the china, fancy work, domestic science and floral departments the exhibits were large, many exquisite pieces of china and needlework being on display. The work of the schools of the county attracted much attention by reason of its variedness and
