700 Men on Pay Roll.

There are now seven hundred men on the permanent pay roll of the Union Pacific at this terminal, this not including the men employed at the ice houses, which vary in number. The approximate number in each classification is as follows: Shops, round-house and car department 280, engibrakemen on Third district and branch including the passenger service 140, office and yard men 40. In only one department has there been a decrease within the past year or so, and that is in the shop and round house force, this showing a falling off of about forty-five.

The wages of these men range from \$55.00 to \$180 per month.
