Whereas in a trial of the case of John A. Nattlinger et al vs. the board of county commissioners of Lincoln county, Nebraska, the district judge has decided said case in favor of the plaintiffs and have enjoined the county commissioners from establishing road number 20 where this board believes it is to be to the best interests of the public in Lincoln county, Nebraska, and whereas, the court has held that the county board did not have any power to establish said road; Therefore, be it resolved by the county board that the county attorney is hereby directed to at once appeal said case to the supreme court of Nebraska in order that this board may have determined by the supreme court its powers with reference to the county roads in this county.
