Scott Reynolds

FORNER DEPUTY SHERIFF LOWELL SHOT AT OMAHA.

Cal. A. Lowell, deputy sheriff of Lincoln county under Sheriff Milton Berger, but for several years past a railroad detective for the Illinois Central, was shot in the hip at Omaha last Thursday night. The Omaha Bee gives the following particulars:

Special Detective C. A. Lowell of the Illinois Central railroad was taken to the St. Joseph's hospital in a serious condition as the result of a gun battle between himself and three armed men in the yards near the Omaha box factory in East Omaha about midnight.

As Detective Lowell was walking in regular rounds of the yards at that place alone, three armed men slipped up behind him and, after telling him to halt one of them said, "Now we've got you and we'll get rid of you, too," and then shot, hitting Lowell in the left hip and causing him to drop the shot gun which he was carrying. He immediately regained his balance after the shock and drawing his automatic fired the entire contents at the men, but owing to the darkness he was unable to tell definitely whether he hit one of the men, though he stated that he was certain that he did.

After the men had left him Lowell crawled nearly half a mile to the office of the Omaha box factory where he aroused the night watchman and had him notify the local police. The emergency car manned by a squad of detectives and officers and Police Surgeon Miller was rushed to the scene. The Council Bluffs department was also notified and sent its patrol, as the night watchman stated that he first thought Lowell had been shot in Iowa, the dividing line between the two states being only a few feet from the scene of the attack.

Lowell is a resident of Chicago, where he has a wife and family. The relatives have been notified by the police of the shooting.
