PROHIBITION BILL PASSES: NOW GOES TO GOVERNOR

The state senate Wednesday forenoon passed the conference prohibition bill by a vote of thirty to three.

Against sale and manufacture of all intoxicating liquor.

For possession of liquor in private homes for personal use.

When complaint is made possession of liquor by person complained of regarded as prima facie evidence of intent to violate law.

That all liquor dealers and manufacturers must dispose of stocks by May 1st.

Governor responsible for enforcement of law and will have \$50,000 fund for this purpose.

Fine of \$100, or thirty days in jail, or both for first offense.

Emergency clause, making bill effective May 1st.

Food Prices in Omaha

The Omaha Bee of yesterday published the present price of food stuffs in that city, showing the per cent of increase compared with six months ago.

Here are some of the present day prices given, compare them with North Platte prices, adding freight, and see how Omaha and North Platte prices compare.

The Bee says that prices of twenty-two staple food products show an average increase of 65 per cent in Omaha during the past six months.

Beans increased 400 per cent, corn meal 100 per cent, potatoes 90 per cent and meats 60 per cent in six months.
