The registration cards which are to be used under the conscription law were received Saturday by Sheriff Salisbury.

The questions on the cards are: Name in full (Given name) (Family Name) age in years...

Where were you born? (Town) (State) (Nation). If not a citizen, of what country are you a citizen or subject?

What is your present trade, occupation or office? By Whom employed? Where employed?

Have you a father, mother, wife, or child under 12, or a sister or brother under 12, solely dependent on you for support (specify which)?

Married or single? (Which?) Race (specify which)? What military service have you had?

Rank; branch; years; nation or state? Do you claim exemption from draft? (Specify grounds).

Exemptions Unchanged.

Exemptions from the selective draft in the army bill conference agreement were left virtually as suggested by the general staff.

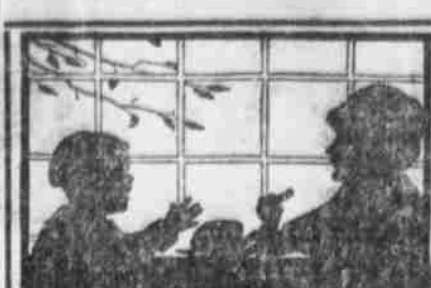
