PREPARATIONS FOR WAR ARE MOVING RAPIDLY

The war army bill as passed by congress and finally reviewed at the War Department went back to the White House and was signed by President Wilson Thursday night.

Meanwhile the War department is pushing vigorously its preparations to mobilize the National Guard, which, with the regulars, forms the first line army. It was announced that all existing regiments of the guard will be called into service by August 5, and officials estimate that with from a month to six weeks' intensive training these troops will be ready to go forward for final preparation behind the fighting lines in Europe for the fighting that is before them.

ORINANCE NO. An Ordinance Relating to the Care of Sidewalks and Providing for Keeping Same Free from Snow.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of North Platte, Nebraska: Section 1. That Section 25, of an ordinance passed and approved April 6, 1914, entitled: An ordinance concerning the water works of the city of North Platte, Nebraska, regulating and governing the same, establishing water rates, rates and regulations for the governing of water consumers and others, providing for the installation of meters and for the protection of water works, including pipes, hydrants and other apparatus and providing costs and penalties; repeating all ordinances and parts thereof in conflict with this ordinance.

Section 1. That Section 25, of an ordinance passed and approved April 6, 1914, entitled: An ordinance concerning the water works of the city of North Platte, Nebraska, regulating and governing the same, establishing water rates, rates and regulations for the governing of water consumers and others, providing for the installation of meters and for the protection of water works, including pipes, hydrants and other apparatus and providing costs and penalties; repeating all ordinances and parts thereof in conflict with this ordinance.

Section 2. Whenever the owner or occupant of any such real estate shall fail or neglect for the space of twenty-four hours after the cessation of any storm or fall of snow to remove or cause to be removed any and all accumulations of snow or ice on the sidewalk adjoining or abutting the said real estate by him or her owned or occupied, the city commissioner shall forthwith cause the removal of the snow from such sidewalk, and the expense of such removal shall be assessed against and collected in the same manner as provided by law for the assessment and collection of special taxes.

Section 3. Any person whose duty it is under this ordinance to remove any sidewalk free from such accumulations of snow and ice who shall fail or neglect to do so, as herein provided, shall, for each failure or neglect to do, shall upon conviction be fined any sum not exceeding \$25.00 and shall stand committed until such fine and costs are paid.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval and publication according to law.

ORINANCE NO. An Ordinance Relating to the Care of Sidewalks and Providing for Keeping Same Free from Snow.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of North Platte, Nebraska: Section 1. That Section 25, of an ordinance passed and approved April 6, 1914, entitled: An ordinance concerning the water works of the city of North Platte, Nebraska, regulating and governing the same, establishing water rates, rates and regulations for the governing of water consumers and others, providing for the installation of meters and for the protection of water works, including pipes, hydrants and other apparatus and providing costs and penalties; repeating all ordinances and parts thereof in conflict with this ordinance.

Section 2. Whenever the owner or occupant of any such real estate shall fail or neglect for the space of twenty-four hours after the cessation of any storm or fall of snow to remove or cause to be removed any and all accumulations of snow or ice on the sidewalk adjoining or abutting the said real estate by him or her owned or occupied, the city commissioner shall forthwith cause the removal of the snow from such sidewalk, and the expense of such removal shall be assessed against and collected in the same manner as provided by law for the assessment and collection of special taxes.

Section 3. Any person whose duty it is under this ordinance to remove any sidewalk free from such accumulations of snow and ice who shall fail or neglect to do so, as herein provided, shall, for each failure or neglect to do, shall upon conviction be fined any sum not exceeding \$25.00 and shall stand committed until such fine and costs are paid.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval and publication according to law.

ORINANCE NO. An Ordinance Pertaining to Dealers in Junk and Second Hand Goods, Licensing Such Business and Providing a Penalty for the Violation Hereof.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of North Platte, Nebraska: Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporation to engage in the business of buying or selling junk or second hand goods without first having taken out a license and complying with the terms of this ordinance and such license shall be for the sum of \$25.00 per year payable in advance, said year commencing on the first day of June, and each year thereafter.

Section 2. Every person, persons, firm or corporation, taking out such license required to maintain a place of business in the city of North Platte, and to keep a complete record of all goods purchased and sold and which record shall contain the name of all goods purchased and sold, and the person or persons from whom bought or to whom sold, the date of the purchase or sale and the description of the goods and said record shall be open during the business hours to public inspection and the licensee or his agents required to furnish any additional information required as to the nature of the purchase or sale.

Section 3. Any person, persons, firm or corporation violating any of the terms or provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$100.00 and shall stand committed until such fine and costs of prosecution are paid.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of North Platte, Nebraska: Section 1. That the offer of the North Platte Cemetery Association, to deed and convey unto the city of North Platte, Nebraska, the North Platte cemetery and the land and grounds thereon, together with all of the personal property belonging to said association, and to pay into the treasury of said city, and for the cemetery fund thereof, the moneys on hand belonging to said association, and the same to be accepted, and the Mayor of said city is hereby authorized to receive and accept the same to be duly recorded with the county clerk of Lincoln county, Nebraska.

Section 2. That a "cemetery board," be, and the same is hereby created, the members thereof to serve without pay, and the following persons be, and hereby are appointed as members of said board to serve for the periods of time designated here their respective names: to-wit: Olive Salisbury and Wm. E. Shuman for a term of one year, expiring on the 31st day of May, 1918; Wm. E. Shuman for a term of two years, expiring on May 1, 1918; Mayne Koolby and J. Carl Tollman for a term of three years, expiring on May 1, 1921.

Section 3. That the cemetery board shall have, and is hereby granted, full power and authority to promulgate, establish and enforce rules and regulations for the management, general care improvement, beautifying and welfare of the North Platte cemetery, and such rules and regulations prepared and promulgated by the said cemetery board, shall be in full force and effect of ordinances duly passed by the mayor and council of the city of North Platte, Nebraska. That said board shall have the power and authority to promulgate such labor and assistants, and to make such contracts and to purchase such materials as they may deem necessary for the purpose aforesaid, but no member of said board shall be directly or indirectly interested financially in any such contracts, purchases or affairs of such cemetery.

Section 4. That all deeds of conveyance of lots or parts of lots within said cemetery shall be executed by the mayor of said city and attested by the city clerk thereof, under the seal of said city, and shall be executed, and delivered to the purchaser thereof, upon sales made by the cemetery board, and after the purchase price, such lots, or parts of lots, shall have been paid into the city treasury and into the cemetery fund thereof. All moneys received from the sales of lots from any other source whatsoever shall be paid direct into the city treasury and into the cemetery fund, and warrants upon this fund shall be drawn by the cemetery board for the expenditures made by said board in connection with the general care, management, improvement, beautifying and welfare of said cemetery and shall be paid by the treasurer of said city.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.

ORINANCE NO. An Ordinance Relating to the Care of Sidewalks and Providing for Keeping Same Free from Snow.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of North Platte, Nebraska: Section 1. That it shall be the duty of every owner and occupant of any real estate in the city of North Platte, Nebraska, adjoining or abutting which any sidewalk is or shall hereafter be constructed or is existing, to keep the said sidewalk to be kept at all times free from any accumulation of snow, ice.

Section 2. Whenever the owner or occupant of any such real estate shall fail or neglect for the space of twenty-four hours after the cessation of any storm or fall of snow to remove or cause to be removed any and all accumulations of snow or ice on the sidewalk adjoining or abutting the said real estate by him or her owned or occupied, the city commissioner shall forthwith cause the removal of the snow from such sidewalk, and the expense of such removal shall be assessed against and collected in the same manner as provided by law for the assessment and collection of special taxes.

Section 3. Any person whose duty it is under this ordinance to remove any sidewalk free from such accumulations of snow and ice who shall fail or neglect to do so, as herein provided, shall, for each failure or neglect to do, shall upon conviction be fined any sum not exceeding \$25.00 and shall stand committed until such fine and costs are paid.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval and publication according to law.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of North Platte, Nebraska: Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporation to engage in the business of buying or selling junk or second hand goods without first having taken out a license and complying with the terms of this ordinance and such license shall be for the sum of \$25.00 per year payable in advance, said year commencing on the first day of June, and each year thereafter.

Section 2. Every person, persons, firm or corporation, taking out such license required to maintain a place of business in the city of North Platte, and to keep a complete record of all goods purchased and sold and which record shall contain the name of all goods purchased and sold, and the person or persons from whom bought or to whom sold, the date of the purchase or sale and the description of the goods and said record shall be open during the business hours to public inspection and the licensee or his agents required to furnish any additional information required as to the nature of the purchase or sale.

Section 3. Any person, persons, firm or corporation violating any of the terms or provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$100.00 and shall stand committed until such fine and costs of prosecution are paid.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.
