

### FORTY-SIX MORE MEN TO GO NEXT THURSDAY

Forty-six more Lincoln county men will entrain for Ft. Riley, Kan., next Thursday morning, October 4th, at eight. These directions were received this morning from the governor's office by Sheriff Salisbury, member of the examining board. On account of the local board being in session today examining the first fifty of the one hundred men called the early part of the week, the names of those who will be sent to Ft. Riley will not be made up until tonight.

Whether forty-six men are available for this call without incurring at least as alternates some of the men who will be examined and passed today and tomorrow, will not be known by the board until they are checked up at the meeting to be held late this evening. The board is somewhat "up in the air," for not all the names sent to the district board have been acted upon and the local board does not therefore know how many will be exempted or certified for service. The available "stock" of men on hand subject to be sent to Ft. Riley is not in any event large and the board may run pretty close on the call.

Including the present call to colors, Lincoln county will have sent eighty-five per cent of its quota to Ft. Riley, leaving but eighteen men yet to be sent. It is believed, however, that the Washington authorities are getting ready to issue a call for not less than 500,000 men, in which event Lincoln county would be required to furnish in the neighborhood of one hundred more men. It is also probable that orders will be given shortly to call in for examination every man who registered, in order that each one may know his status, that is, whether he is to be certified or whether he is to be exempted. It might not be out of place for every drafted man in Lincoln county who does intend to claim exemption to look ahead and make his arrangements for becoming a soldier within the next six months.

### THE COUNTY FAIR IS PROVING A REAL SUCCESS

The Lincoln county fair opened Wednesday afternoon at the city park under the most favorable conditions—we say favorable, for the weather or is all that could be desired and the exhibits are such as to prove an index of the wonderful productiveness of Lincoln county as an agricultural and stock producing section. And not only in this line is the fair a success, for through the exhibits of school work we learn what our children are doing in their daily tasks; by the exhibit of hospital needs we are informed of the splendid work being done by that noble organization known as the Red Cross Society; through the exhibit of the State Historical Society we have an opportunity to know much of the early history of the state. In the entertaining line the provisions are ample. The horse races are proving exceptionally good, the wild west features are the real thing, and the free attractions are such as to command compliments. In addition there are a number of paid attractions provided by the Hodgson Shows.

Never before has agricultural hall contained a greater or more varied exhibit of small grain, corn and vegetables. There isn't an inch of this section of the building that is not taken up, and the exhibits are very attractively displayed. In another section of the hall is found samples of the vegetables grown in the gardens of the school boys and girls, and exhibit that is very creditable. In another section is found the county school exhibit of every day work, a showing that gives a comprehensive view of what the boys and girls are doing. In this building is found the exhibit of the state historical society, a showing that is intensely interesting. Nearby are articles the Red Cross Society is making for the army hospitals, and for the daily use of the soldiers in the handy article known as "comfort kit." Then in other sections we find the domestic science display and an exhibit of flowers. Taken as a whole the building is a most interesting place to visit and an hour or so can be profitably spent.

Every stall in the horse barn and in the cattle barn is filled with animals that are highly bred and registered. In the horse exhibit are three animals owned by W. E. Coates of Keosauqua and three by W. W. Buchanan of Ogallala, these in addition to equally good horses owned by Lincoln county men.

The cattle showing is good, a number of breeds being represented, all fine looking and with lineages that prove the blood. The display of hogs is not as heavy proportionately as horses and cattle, but there are twelve or fifteen pens of the different breeds. The poultry building is well filled, over one hundred pens of chickens, ducks and pet stock being shown. Included is J. A. McDonald's \$100 Light Brahma rooster.

Down by the grand stand are centered the tented shows, the refreshment stands, and the various catch-penny devices found at a county show. Here also is located the automobile exhibits in tents, all the local dealers being represented in one way or another. Sevastian & Holman have a tent in which to boost insurance, and as a feature have the burned wreck of an auto. There is a mill that makes

cider from apples while you wait; tractors are demonstrated; there is an alfalfa grinder, a wire stretching machine and other implements of interest to the farmer.
