Postmaster McEvoy received word

Postmaster McEvoy received word yesterday that the application for a new daily mail route which will cover a large territory north of the river has been granted. This comes after five years of effort on the part of the postmaster and the people to be served.

The route goes east on Fourth street, serving families on that street not served by city delivery, crossing the Lincoln highway bridge and goes east to the former Macey place, thence north to the Furdy ranch, thence west along the foothills to the D. B. McNeel ranch, thence south to the south river road, thence east to the bridge and south on Locust, serving the houses on north Locust not covered by city delivery. In the neighborhood of one hundred families will be served. The service will begin as soon as the roads are repaired, boxes placed and other preliminary work completed.

Old No. 1 route, which runs up between the rivers will be consolidated with this new route, and one carrier will serve the entire district, and in doing so will cover sixty-three miles daily. The carrier, who now receives \$1200 a year will receive \$1800 when the routes are consolidated. The consolidation will call for an examination for carrier.
