GRACE FREEMAN DIES FROM OVERDOSE OF CHLOROFORM

Grace Freeman, aged about twentyone, neat appearing and a trained nurse by vocation, was found dead in her room at the McCabe Hotel at 4:30 Tuesday afternoon The deceased ar rived Sunday from Grand Island and registered, giving her address as Cedar Rapids, Iowa. She informed attaches of the hotel that she was a trained nurse, and her business card bore the address of Ord. Neb

Monday afternoon Mr. Weingand in passing through the hallway heard groans fasuing from the room occupied by the girl. He pushed back the part ly-opened door and asked if she waa sick. She replied she had an intense headache. He noticed a bottle lying baside her and asked what medicine she was taking. "Chloroform" was the reply. Mr. Weingand remonstrated against her using the drug, but she laughingly replied that she was a trained nurse and knew how to use it A physician was suggested but to this she objected, stating that if he objected to her being in the house she would go to a hospital. The girl remained in the room until Tuesday noon when she went out on the streets, re turning about 1:30. In the meantime Mr. Weingand became pretty well satisfied that the girl was a chloroform drinker. Tuesday afternoon about 4:30 he concluded it would be well to inquire about her condition, and receiving no response to a knock the of the room was rooh open ed and the woman was found lifeless in bed, she having taken off her outer garments. The coroner was notified and an examination of her effects disclosed three bottles of chloroform, one of which had been partially emptied.

Inquiry by phone at Ord developed that she had no relatives there, but that she had been an inmate at a hospital at Grand Island, presumably taking treatment for the "dope" habit


